WARRANTY DEED TO CREATE ESTATE BY THE ENTIRETY

This Indenture Witnesseth, THAT

Walter H. Hoag and Allison L. Hoag,
husband and wife,

hereinafter known as grantor, for and in consideration of
the sum of Ten and no/100ths Dollars,
to them paid, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain,
sell and convey unto Richard C. Beesley and Ruth I. Beesley,
husband and wife, the following described premises, situated in Klamath County, Oregon,
to wit:

All that part of the SW 1/4 and all that part of lot 4 of Section 29, Township
10 N., 9 E., R. 11 E., lying West of the right of way line of the California Northeastern
Railway Company, SAVING AND EXCEPTING that property described in Vol. 238, page 122,
Deed records of Klamath County, Oregon, and also excepting any portion thereof lying
within existing roadways, ditches, canals, and laterals.

Subject to rights of United States of America, under Declaration of Taking (for
Lost River Diversion Channel), recorded March 11, 1949, in Book 229 of Deeds, page
108, Records of Klamath County, Oregon, and subject to contract and/or lien for
irrigation and/or drainage, easements and rights of way of record and apparent on
the land, exceptions and restrictions contained in deed from Diversion Channel
Company to Robert W. Hunt and Doris Hunt recorded February 1, 1945, in Vol. 173 of
page 22, Klamath County Deed records.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said premises with their appurtenances unto the said
