

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION MAY 2 3 1966 FRANK J. HEALY SPRAGUE RIVER WATER ASSOCIATION CORPORATION COMMISSIONER We, the undersigned, all of whom are residents of Klamath County, State of Oregon, do hereby voluntarily associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-stock cooperative association under the provisions of Oregon Cooperative Corporation Act, Title 7, Chapter 62, O.R.S. as amended. ARTICLE I The name of this association shall be SPRAGUE RIVER WATER 10 ASSOCIATION, a cooperative. ARTICLE II 12 The nature of the business of the association and the objects 13 and purposes for which or for any of which this association is formed are: To associate its members together for their mutual bene-15 fit and to further the rehabilitation of said members, and to that end to construct, maintain and operate a private water 16 system for the supplying of water for domestic, livestock, garden, commercial and industrial purposes to its members, 17 and for the sale of any surplus water remaining after the need of its members have been satisfied, and to engage in any 18 activity related thereto, including, but not limited to, the acquisition of water by appropriation, drilling, pumping and/or purchase, and the purchase, laying, installation, operation, maintenance and repair of wells and springs, pumping equip-19 ment, water mains, pipe lines, valves, meters and all other equipment necessary to the construction, maintenance and oper-20 21 ation of a water system. 22 (b) To borrow from any source, money, goods or services without limitation as to amount of corporate indebtedness or 23 liability; and to pledge or mortgage any of its property as security therefor in any manner permitted by law. 24 (c) To acquire, and to hold, own and exercise all rights of 25 ownership in, and to sell, transfer or pledge shares of capital stock or bonds, or become a member or a stockholder 26 of any corporation or association engaged in any related activities. 27 To buy, lease, hold and exercise all privileges of owner-28 ship in and to such real or personal property as may be necessary or convenient for the conduct and operation of the busi-29 ness of the association or incidental thereto. 30 To establish reserves and to invest the funds thereof in stocks, bonds and other property as the board of directors may 31 deem satisfactory. To have and exercise all powers, privileges and rights 32

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conferred on corporations by the laws of the State of Oregon and all powers and rights incidental in carrying out the purposes for which this association is formed, except such as are inconsistent with the express provisions of the act under which this association is incorporated.

(g) The foregoing shall be construed both as objects and powers, and the enumeration thereof shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the general powers conferred on this association by the laws of the State of Oregon, all of which are hereby expressly claimed.

### ARTICLE III

The place where the principal business of the association is to be transacted is the Town of Sprague River, County of Klamath, State of Oregon, but the association may maintain offices and places of business at such other places within the State of Oregon as the board of directors may determine. The address of its registered office is Post Office Box 373, Sprague River, Oregon, and the name of the registered agent at such address is CLAUDETTE BARKLEY.

#### ARTICLE IV

The period of existence of this association shall be perpetual.

### ARTICLE V

The private property of the members shall not be subject to payment of association debts to any extent whatsoever.

#### ARTICLE VI

Section 1. This association shall not have capital stock, but its capital shall be represented by membership certificates.

Section 2. Under the terms and conditions prescribed by its By-Laws, this association shall admit as members such persons as are bona fide owners or occupants of farmsteads or dwellings, bona fide owners or operators of industrial installations or commercial establishments, and bona fide public or non-profit institutions having reasonable accessibility to the source of, and who are in need of having water supplied for domestic, livestock, garden, commercial and industrial purposes from the water system constructed; maintained and operated by the association, but the association shall not be required to admit members if the capacity of its water system is exhausted by the needs of its existing members and all such other persont to whom it has been supplying water.

Section 3. The membership fee in this association shall be Eight and No/100, (\$8.00), Dollars. The voting paid and who is in good standing shall be equal, and each member shall be entitled to one vote only. There shall be no voting by proxy. New members upon their admission in this association shall be entitled to one vote and to share in the property of the association equally with the old members. When a member has paid his membership fee in full, he shall receive a certificate of membership.

Section 4. This association is organized on a non-profit basis for the mutual benefit and rehabilitation of its members, and consequently will not have profits from which to pay dividends on its capital. After all expenses of the association have been

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paid and reasonable reserves, as determined by the board of directors, set aside, the net earnings of the association shall be accumulated in a surplus fund for the purpose of replacing, enlarging, extending, and repairing the system and property of the association and for such other purposes as the board of directors may determine to be for the best interests of the association. The said surplus fund or any portion thereof may from time to time at the discretion of the board of directors, be distributed to the members as provided in the By-Laws, on the basis of the charges made and levied against and paid by such members during the year.

Section 5. Any member who desires to dispose of his membership certificate must first offer the same to the association at its fair book value. If the association shall fail, after thirty days notice in writing, to purchase the membership certificate, the certificate may be transferred upon the books of the association upon the surrender of the certificate by the holder thereof or by his legal representatives, but only with the approval of the board of directors, only to a person eligible to become a member and only when the transferring member is free from indebtedness to the association. All transfers of membership certificates must be made upon the books of the association.

The five directors who are to serve until the First Annual Meeting of Members or until their successors are elected and take office are:

## ARTICLE IX

The members of any duly called meeting of the members may adopt a resolution of the board of directors for the voluntary dissolution or liquidation of the cooperative. The notice of such a meeting must state that the dissolution or liquidation is up for consideration. If a resolution to dissolve or liquidate is adopted, the resolution shall include the basis of distribution of assets, and this basis may, provide that the balance of the assets after the payments of all debts of the cooperative have been paid in full shall be reduced to cash and equally divided among the members provided that any sum due the cooperative by a member shall be deducted from the member's share and the total deductions shall then be divided among the members. In the event that at the time the meeting is called to propose the dissolution or liquidation of the cooperative, if all or a part of the assets of the cooperative are mortgaged or otherwise hypothecated to the United States of America acting through the Farmers Home Administration or its successors, actual notice of the proposed meeting and its purpose must be delivered in person to the agent of the United States to whom pay-

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ments on the mortgage indebtedness are or should be paid and, thereafter, the United States of America acting through the Farmers Home Administration or its successors shall have the option at any time within ninety days of receipt of notice, to elect to purchase the assets of the cooperative at their value subject to the mortgage or to arrange for a sale and transfer to some other person, ogroup or entity at their value subject to the mortgage.
