To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

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WHEREAS,

Stephen A. Girard,

being the owner of a certain tract of land situated and included within the limits of the Fremont National Forest, Oregon, has, under the provisions of the Act approved March 20, 1922 (42 Stat. 465), as amended (16 U.S.C. 485), reconveyed and relinquished the said tract to the United States and has, under the provisions of said Act, selected in lieu thereof the following described tract of land:

Willamette Meridian, Oregon.

T. 35 S., R. 14 E.,

Sec. 19, S $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$;

Sec. 20, W $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, and NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$;

Sec. 29, SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$;

Containing 280.00 acres;

NOW KNOW YE, that there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said claimant the land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said land with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said claimant, his successors and assigns, forever;

EXCEPTING AND RESERVING TO THE UNITED STATES from the land so granted:

1. A right-of-way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States. Act of August 30, 1890, 26 Stat. 391; 43 U.S.C. 945; and

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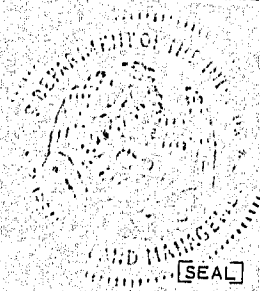
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2. In accordance with the provisions of the Act of February 28, 1925 (43 Stat. 1090), to it, and its assigns, an easement for the existing North Sprague Road No. 331, 66 feet in width, being 33 feet on each side of the centerline thereof, with as much additional width as required for the adequate protection of cuts and fills, said centerline being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the south line of said Section 29, which point is 726 feet, more or less, westerly of the southeast corner of said Section 29; thence traversing in a northerly direction over and across the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 29 to a point on the north line of said SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, which point is 396 feet, more or less, west and 1320 feet, more or less, north of the southeast corner of said Section 29,

T. 35 S., R. 14 E., W.M.

Provided, that if for a period of five (5) years the United States, or its assigns, shall cease to use, or preserve for prospective future use, the above road, or any segment thereof, for the purposes reserved, or if at any time the authorized officer of the United States determines that the road, or any segment thereof, is no longer needed for the purposes reserved, the easement traversed thereby shall terminate. In the event of such nonuse, or of such determination by the authorized officer, the authorized officer shall furnish to the patentee, his successors or assigns, a statement in recordable form evidencing termination.



IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the undersigned authorized officer of the Bureau of Land Management, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of June 17, 1948 (62 Stat. 476), has, in the name of the United States, caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the Bureau to be hereunto affixed.
