QUITCLAIM DEED

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, acting by and through the Regional Director, Mid-Pacific Region for the Secretary of the Interior, in pursuance of the Act of Congress approved June 17, 1902 (32 Stat. 388) and acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto and particularly to the Act of Congress approved June 30, 1949 (63 Stat. 377), as amended and supplemented and orders, circulars and delegations made and issued thereunder, does in consideration of FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50.00) to it in hand paid, receipt of which is duly acknowledged hereby quitclaim to John W. Crosslin and Miriam E. Crosslin, husband and wife, without warranty of title all of its right, title and interest in and to all that certain real property situated in the County of Klamath, State of Oregon, more particularly described as follows:

> A parcel of land in Section Thirty-six (36), Township Thirty-nine (39) South, Range Seven (7) East, W.M., being a portion of that 60foot-wide tract of land along the easterly boundary of said Section 36, as described in the conveyance from Thomas McCormick, et ux., to the United States of America, recorded on August 9, 1909, in Book 27 of Official Records at page 294, Klamath County Records, State of Oregon, and also described in the deed from William M. Brennen, et ux, to John W. Crosslin, et ux., dated May 8, 1942, and recorded in Volume 147 at page 197, in said County and State, and described as follows:

The east 40 feet of the west 60 feet of the north 660 feet of the south 1,320 feet of said Section, Township, and Range.
