Homeowners may pay such cost to Pacific at any time prior to the time payment is due. 5. The notice must include the name of the Homeowners, the address of the property, the name of the person to whom the property is being sold or transferred, and the name of any person or company who is acting as a closing agent for the sale or transfer or is otherwise participating in the transaction. SECURITY /NTEREST To secure the Homeowners' obligations herein, Homeowners hereby mortgage to Pacific the property, together with all present and future appurtenances, improvements, and fixtures thereto. This paragraph shall not take effect i still that date which is one day prior to the earliest to occur of the following dates:

(1) the date on which any legal or equitable interest in any part of the property is transferred;
 (2) the date on which any legal or equitable interest in any part of the property which does not exist as of the date of this agreement is created, including without limitation any deed, lien, mockgage, judgment or land sale contract;
 (3) the date on which any action or suit is filed to forcelose or recover on the property or any part thereof for any mortgage, lien, judgment or other encumbrance on the property or any part thereof which existed prior to the recording date of this agreement.

7. PERFECTION OF SECURITY INTEREST .....

Pacific may record this agreement in the county real property records, and Homeowners shall execute any other documents /eemed necessary by Pacific to perfect this security interest.
