FINDINGS OF FACT:

- 1. The site is adequate in size and shape to house the proposed activity as it fits in with the land area by the fact that there are no residences nearby and it is uninhabited land.
- 2. The site has adequate access to the streets and highways to carry the traffic flow generated by the proposed use.
- 3. There will be no adverse effect on abutting property owners
- 4. No one testified in opposition to the Conditional Use Permit.
- 5. The granting of this Conditional Use Permit is consistent with the goals of the L. C. D. C.
- 6. The Conditional Use Permit is approved subject to the following conditions.
