CONTRACT—REAL ESTATE

THIS CONTRACT, Made this 23rd day of April, 19 80, between
William S. Snyder and Carol M. Snyder, husband and wife
 and Robert J. DiGiacomo and Susan L. DiGiacomo, husband and wife, hereinafter called the seller,
 and Robert J. DiGiacomo and Susan L. DiGiacomo, husband and wife, hereinafter called the buyer,

WITNESSETH: That in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the seller
 agrees to sell unto the buyer and the buyer agrees to purchase from the seller all of the following described lands
 and premises situated in Klamath County, State of Oregon, to-wit:

A portion of Lot 2, Block 64, NICHOLS ADDITION TO THE CITY OF
 KLAMATH FALLS, in the County of Klamath, State of Oregon, more
 particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the most Easterly corner of said Lot 2, and running
 Northwesterly parallel with 8th Street 120 feet; thence South-
 westerly at right angles to 8th Street 48.75 feet; thence South-
 easterly parallel with 8th Street 120 feet; thence Northeasterly
 at right angles with 8th Street 48.75 feet to the place of

beginning. Nineteen thousand, fifty-four 07/100 Dollars (\$19,054.07),
 hereinafter called the purchase price, of which \$4,100.00 has been paid at the time of the execution
 hereof, the receipt whereof hereby is acknowledged by the seller; the buyer agrees to pay the balance of said purchase
 price to the order of the seller at the times and in the amounts as follows, to-wit:

\$217.00 per month beginning May 10, 1980 and the 10 every month
 thereafter

The buyer warrants to and covenants with the seller that the real property described in this contract is

(A) primarily for buyer's personal, family, household or agricultural purposes.

All of said purchase price may be paid at any time; all deferred balances of said purchase price shall bear interest at the rate of 15% per
 cent per annum from April 23, 1980 until paid, interest to be paid monthly and being included in
 the minimum regular payments above required. Taxes on said premises for the current year shall be prorated between the parties hereto as of
April 23, 1980.

The buyer shall be entitled to possession of said lands on April 23, 1980, and may retain such possession so long as
 he is not in default under the terms of this contract. The buyer agrees that at all times he will keep the premises and the buildings, now or hereafter erected
 thereon, in good condition and repair and will not suffer or permit any waste or strain thereof; that he will keep said premises free from construction and all
 other liens and save the seller harmless therefrom and reimburse seller for all costs and attorney's fees incurred by him in defending against any such liens,
 that he will pay all taxes hereafter levied against said property, as well as all water rents, public charges and municipal liens which hereafter lawfully may
 be imposed upon said premises, all promptly before the same or any part thereof become past due, that at buyer's expense, he will insure and keep insured
 all buildings now or hereafter erected on said premises against loss or damage by fire (with extended coverage) in an amount not less than \$Full Insurable Value
 in a company or companies satisfactory to the seller, with loss payable first to the seller and then to the buyer as their respective interests may appear and
 all policies of insurance to be delivered to the seller as soon as insured. Now if the buyer shall fail to pay any such liens, costs, water rents, taxes, or charges
 or to procure and pay for such insurance, the seller may do so and any payment so made shall be added to and become a part of the debt secured by this
 contract and shall bear interest at the rate aforesaid, without waiver, however, of any right arising to the seller for buyer's breach of contract.
 The said described premises are now subject to a contract or a mortgage (the word mortgage as used herein includes within its meaning a trust deed)
 recorded in the Deed, Mortgage and Lien Records of said county in book/reel/volume No. m-78 on page 17946 thereof or as
 document/fee/file/instrument/microfilm No. 1495407 (reference to which hereby is made) on which the unpaid principal balance thereof at this
 time is \$ 14,954.07 and no more, with interest paid to April 23, 1980, payable in installments of not
 less than \$ 217.00 per month; the seller agrees to pay all sums due and to become due on said contract or mortgage promptly at
 the times required for said payments and to keep said contract or mortgage free from default; should any of the installments on said mortgage so paid by
 the seller include taxes or insurance premiums on said described premises, the buyer agrees on seller's demand forthwith to repay to the seller that portion of
 said installments so paid applicable to taxes and insurance premiums; should the seller for any reason permit said contract or mortgage to be or become in
 default, the buyer may pay any sums required by said contract or mortgage to be paid or otherwise perform said contract or mortgage and the buyer shall
 be entitled to credit for all sums so paid by him against the sums next to become due on the above purchase price pursuant to the terms of this contract.

The seller agrees that at his expense and within 30 days from the date hereof, he will furnish unto buyer a title insurance policy in-
 suring (in an amount equal to said purchase price) marketable title in and to said premises in the seller on or subsequent to the date of this agreement, save
 and except the usual printed exceptions and the building and other restrictions and easements now of record, if any, and the said contract or mortgage. Seller
 also agrees that when said purchase price is fully paid and upon request and upon surrender of this agreement, he will deliver a good and sufficient deed con-
 veying said premises in fee simple unto the buyer, his heirs and assigns, free and clear of all encumbrances since said date placed, permitted or arising by,
 through or under seller, excepting, however, the said easements and restrictions, and the taxes, municipal liens, water rents and public charges so assumed by
 the buyer and further excepting all liens and encumbrances created by the buyer or his assigns.

And it is understood and agreed between said parties that time is of the essence of this contract, and in case the buyer shall fail to make the payments above required, or any of them, punctually within 20 days of the time limited therefor, or fail to keep any agreement herein contained, then the seller at his option shall have the following rights: (1) to declare this contract null and void, (2) to declare the whole unpaid principal balance of said purchase price with equity, and in any of such cases, all rights and interest created or then existing in favor of the buyer as against the seller hereunder shall utterly cease and determine and the right to the possession of the premises above described and all other rights acquired by the buyer hereunder shall revert to and rest in said seller without any act of re-entry, or any other act of said seller to be performed and without any right of the buyer of return, reclamation or compensation for case of such default all payments theretofore made on this contract are to be retained by and belong to said seller as the agreed and reasonable rent of said premises up to the time of such default. And the said seller, in case of such default, shall have the right immediately, or at any time thereafter, to enter upon the land aforesaid, without any process of law, and take immediate possession thereof, together with all the improvements and appurtenances thereon or therein belonging.

The buyer further agrees that failure by the seller at any time to require performance by the buyer of any provision hereof shall in no way affect his right hereunder to enforce the same, nor shall any waiver by said seller of any breach of any provision hereof be held to be a waiver of any succeeding breach of any such provision, or as a waiver of the provision itself.

The true and actual consideration paid for this transfer, stated in terms of dollars, is \$19,054.07 (However, the actual consideration paid or included in the property or value given or promised which is the whole consideration (indicate which).)

In case suit or action is instituted to foreclose this contract or to enforce any provision hereof, the losing party in said suit or action agrees to pay such sum as the trial court may adjudge reasonable as attorney's fees to be allowed the prevailing party in said suit or action and if an appeal is taken from any judgment or decree of such trial court, the losing party further promises to pay such sum as the appellate court shall adjudge reasonable as the prevailing party's attorney's fees on such appeal.

In construing this contract, it is understood that the seller or the buyer may be more than one person or a corporation; that if the context so requires, the singular pronoun shall be taken to mean and include the plural, the masculine, the feminine and the neuter, and that generally all grammatical changes shall be made, assumed and implied to make the provisions hereof apply equally to corporations and to individuals.

This agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of, as the circumstances may require, not only the immediate parties hereto but their respective heirs, executors, administrators, personal representatives, successors in interest and assigns as well.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, said parties have executed this instrument in triplicate; if either of the undersigned is a corporation, it has caused its corporate name to be signed and its corporate seal affixed hereto by its officers duly authorized thereunto by order of its board of directors.
