Supplemental Findings and Order

THIS MATTER was first heard by the Ylamath County Hearings Officer on October 8, 1980, upon application of the Stouts for a Conditional Use Permit to keep two cougars. The application was denied by the Hearings Officer and the Stouts appealed this decision to the Klamath County Board of Commissioners. The Board of County Commissioners held hearings on December 22, 1980, and January 14, 1981, and made an unannounced visit to the site on January 5, 1981. The Board of County Commissioners then decided to overturn the decision of the Hearings Officer and conditionally approved the permit. The Board of County Commissioners' approval was then appealed to the Land Use Board of Appeals by a group of neighboring property owners. The Land Use Board of Appeals remanded the case to Klamath County in order that the observations made during the visit to the Stout property and the conclusions drawn therefrom could be discussed at a public hearing before the proponents and opponents. Such a hearing was held before the Board of County Commissioners on August 10, 1981. Based on the testimony presented at this hearing and on the record previously made, the Board of County

FINDINGS OF FACT:

1. The Findings of Fact contained in the Board of

Commissioners makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclu-

County Commissioners' order signed February 18, 1981, are reaffirmed.

2. The following additional findings, based on the Board of County Commissioners' observations of the property, are also made:

a. The property was visited on the morning of January 5, 1981. Commissioners Kuonen, Cheyne and Wynne were present along with Jonathan Chudnoff of the Planning Department staff. The Stouts were not home at the time of the visit.

b. The property in general and the cougar cages in particular appeared to be maintained in a neat and orderly manner.

c. The cages appeared to be well-constructed and secure.

d. The cougars appeared to be tame and showed no excitement or other negative reaction at the approach of four strangers.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

1. The conclusions reached by the Board of County Commissioners, as stated in the order of February 18, 1981, are reaffirmed.

2. Based on observation of the property, the Board of County Commissioners further concludes that the cougars do not present a safety or health hazard to the adjoining properties.

THEREFORE, the Klamath County Board of Commissioners reaffirms its earlier approval of Conditional Use Permit No.
