I. All placer claims must conform as nearly as practicable with the U.S. system of public land surveys and the rectangular subdivisions of such surveys, whether the claims are on surveyed or unsurveyed lands.

Surveys, whether the claims are on surveyed or unsurveyed lands. 2. No location may exceed more than 20 acres for an individual claimant. An association of two persons may locate no more than 40 acres in a single claim; a location by three persons cannot exceed 60 acres. No location of a placer claim can exceed 160 acres whatever the number of individuals in the locating association.

A placer discovery will not sustain a lode location, nor will a lode discovery sustain a placer location. Yein or lode claims are generally located where minerals occur in place in or lodes.
