TRUSTEE'S DEED

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 6th day of July, 1984, between Frank R. Alley, III called trustee, and U.S. Creditcorp, an Oregon corporation hereinafter called the second party;

WITNESSETH:

RECITALS: Michael S. Mitchell and Rebecca A. Mitchell, as grantor, executed and delivered to Frontier Title and Escrow Co., as trustee, for the benefit of U.S. Creditcorp, an Oregon corporation, as beneficiary, a certain trust deed dated August 13, 1980, duly recorded on August 14, 1980, in the mortgage records of Klamath County, Oregon, in book/reel/volume No. M80 at page 15350, or as fee/file/instrument/microfilm/reception No. (indicate which). In said trust deed the real property therein and hereinafter described was conveyed by said grantor to said trustee to secure, among other things, the performance of certain obligations of the grantor to the said beneficiary. The said grantor thereafter defaulted in his performance of the obligations secured by said trust deed as stated in the notice of default hereinafter mentioned and such default still existed at the time of the sale hereinafter described.

By reason of said default, the owner and holder of the obligations secured by said trust deed, being the beneficiary therein named, or his successor in interest, declared all sums so secured immediately due and owing; a notice of default, containing an election to sell the said real property and to foreclose said trust deed by advertisement and sale to satisfy grantor's said obligations was recorded in the mortgage records of said county on February 14, 1984, in book/reel/volume No. M84 at page 2293 thereof or as fee/file/instrument/microfilm/reception No. (indicate which), to which reference now is made.

After the recording of said notice of default, as aforesaid, the undersigned trustee gave notice of the time for and place of said real property as fixed by him and as required by law; copies of the trustee's said notice of sale were mailed by U.S. registered or certified mail to all persons entitled by law to such notice at their respective last known addresses; the persons named in subsection 1 of Section 86.750 Oregon Revised Statutes were timely served with said notice of sale, all as provided by law and at least 120 days before the day so fixed for said trustee's sale; the persons named in subsection 2 of Section 86.740, Oregon Revised Statutes, were timely served with the notice of sale or given notice of the sale, all as provided by law and at least 90 days before the day so fixed for said trustee's sale. Further, the trustee published a copy of said notice of sale in a newspaper of general circulation in each county in which the said real property is situated, once a week for four successive weeks; the last publication of said notice occurred at least twenty days prior to the date of such sale. The mailing, service and publication of said notice of sale are shown by one or more affidavits or proofs of service duly recorded prior to the date of sale in the mortgage records of said county, said affidavits and proofs, together with the said notice of default and election to sell and the trustee's notice of sale, being now referred to and incorporated in and made a part of this trustee's deed as fully as if set out herein verbatim. On the date of said notice of sale, the undersigned trustee had no actual notice of any person, other than the persons named in said affidavits and proofs having or claiming a lien on or interest in said described real property subsequent to the interest of the trustee in the trust deed.

Pursuant to said notice of sale, the undersigned trustee on June 26, 1984, at the hour of 1:30 o'clock, P.M., of said day, Standard Time as established by Section 187.110, Oregon Revised Statutes, (which was the day and hour to which said sale was postponed for reasons and as expressly permitted by subsection 2 of Section 86.755, Oregon Revised Statutes) (delete words in parenthesis if inapplicable), and at the place so fixed for sale, as aforesaid, in full accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon and pursuant to the powers conferred upon him by said trust deed, sold said real property in one parcel at public auction to the said second party for the sum of \$ 16,147.80, he being the highest and best bidder at such sale and said sum being the highest and best sum bid for said property. The true and actual consideration paid for this transfer is the sum of \$ 16,147.80.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the said sum so paid by the second party in cash, the receipt whereof is acknowledged, and by the authority vested in said trustee by the laws of the State of Oregon and by said trust deed, the trustee does hereby convey unto the second party all interest which the grantor had or had the power to convey at the time of grantor's execution of said trust deed, together with any interest the said grantor or his successors in interest acquired after the execution of said trust deed in and to the following described real property, to-wit:

Lot 6 in Block 1 of Tract No. 1165 Miracle Manor, according to the official plat thereof on file in the office of the County Clerk of Klamath County, Oregon.
