Klamath County Planning Findings of Fact and Order

A hearing was held on this matter on December 20, 1984, pursuant to notice given in conformity with Ordinance No. 45.2, Klamath County, before the Klamath County Hearings Officer, Jim Spindor. The applicants were represented by Nina Pence. The Klamath County Planning Department was represented by Jonathan Chudneff. The Hearings Reporter was Judy Whitaker.

Evidence was presented on behalf of the Department and on behalf of the applicants. There were no adjacent property owners present.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

1. A literal enforcement of the Klamath County Land Development Code would result in an unnecessary hardship for the applicant in that the placement of the original houses and a garage limit the amount of space available for parking and driveway.

- The condition causing the above-mentioned hardship 2. was not created by the applicants.
- The granting of this variance would not be detrimental З. to the public health, safety, and welfare, or to the use and enjoyment of adjacent properties and will not be contrary to the intent of this code.
- 4. The granting of this variance is consistent with the goals of the L.C.D.C.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

nis requested variance has been granted based on the following findings of fact:

- This request was to reduce the required number of parking spaces for a dental office from 20 to 19 and to reduce the required driveway width from 15 feet to 10 feet.
- The property in question is in the general commercial zone and is rectangular in shape, being approximately 100' \times 135'.
- The applicants are converting a house into a dental office while retaining a second house on the property as a rental. The location of the two houses and a garage limits the amount of space available for parking and a driveway.
- 4. With a staff of no more than six and no more than six patients at a time, the requested number of parking spaces will

be adequate for the business.

- 5. With regard to the reduction in driveway space, the testimony confirmed that with this being a dental office, there will be no need for any vehicles which would not fit through a ten-foot driveway.
- 6. The approval of these variances would not cause visual or other obstructions on Gettle Street. The five parking spaces in front of the building intrude partway into the 80-foot Gettle Street right of way. However, there is a 25-foot clearance between the parking spaces and the traveled way, which is enough room to turn around in without backing into the traffic.
- 7. No one testified in opposition to the granting of this variance and no evidence was presented that there would be any detrimental effect to the public health, safety, or welfare, or any detrimental effect to abutting property owners.

The Hearings Officer, based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, accordingly orders as follows:

That real property described as

"being generally located at the northwest corner of Crosby and Gettle, and more particularly described as being located on Lots 19 through 22, Block 1, St. Francis Park,"

is hereby conditionally granted variances in accordance with the terms of the Klamath County Zoning Ordinance No. 45.2, and, henceforth, will be allowed to reduce parking spaces for a dental office from 20 to 19 and to reduce driveway width from 15 feet to 10 feet.
