Excerpts from the mining laws of the United States, 30 U.S. Code Annotated

Sec. 15—"Claims usually called 'placers', including all forms of deposit, excepting veins of quartz or other rock in place, shall be subject to entry and patent under the circumstances and conditions, and upon similar proceedings, as are provided for vein and lode claims. * * all placer mining claims * * *shall conform as near as prarticable with the United States system of public-Land surveys, and the rectangular subdivisions of such surveys, and no such location shall include more than twenty acres for each individual claimant."

517.642. "Legal subdivision" defined for OISS 517.642 to 517.652. As used in ORS \$17.642 to 517.652, unless the context requires otherwise, "legal sub-division" means a subdivision of a state survey or of a United States survey which has been extended over the geographic area to be described.

517.64. Lecation of claims upox placer deposits; posting notice. Area and shape of a placer cluim.

A placer discovery will not sustain a lode location, nor will a lode discovery sustain a placer location; Vain or lode claims are generally located where minerals occur in place in weins or lodes. For a lode claim there must be "•• veins or lodes of quarts or other locatin place thering gold, silver, cin-nabar, lead, tin, copper or other valuable deposits ••• ** 30 U.S. Code Sec. 23. Placer claims are generally located where minerals have been derived from rocks or veins to form deposits such as stream gravels and gold-bearing alluvium.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: A mining claim is deemed abandored under 43 U.S. Code Sec. 1744 unless a copy of the official record of the notice of location is filed with the state office of the Bureau of Land Management in Portland within 90 days after the dute of location of the claim.
