No location may exceed more than 20 acres for an individual claimant. An association, of two persons may locate no more than 40 acres in a single An association, of two persons cannot exceed 60 acres. No location of a claim can exceed 160 acres whatever the number of individuals in the locating association.

Vein or lode or placer location. A placer diacovery will inot sustain a lode location, nor will a lode diacovery sustain a placer location. Vein or lode claims are generally located where minerals occur in place in veins or oldes. For a lode claim there must be """ "" winn or lodes of quart is or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, cin-nabar, lead, tin, copper or other vuluable deposits """." 30 U.S. Code Sec. 23. Placer claims are generally located where minerals have been derived from rocks or veins to form deposits such as stream gravels and gold-bearing alluvium.

INFORTANT NOTICE: A mining claim is deemed abandoned under 43 U.S. Code Sec. 1744 unless a copy of the official record of the notice of location is filed with the state office of the Bureau of Land Management in Portland within 90 days after the date of location of the claim. Because BLM recordation regulations charace periods and obtain recordation regulations from your locat BLM office to determine affective requirements for recordation of notices of location, affidavits of annual assessment work, and notices of interion to hold a mining claim. Additional regulations of the BLM and the Forest Service may apply to the conducting of mining operations on national forest and BLM administered lands.
