The total monthly payments on this Contract shall change if the interest rate changes or if the taxes and assessments change. The money paid by Buyer to Seller for the payment of taxes and assessments will not be held in reserve by Seller. When Buyer pays Seller for taxes and assessments, that payment will be subtracted from the balance due on the Contract. When Seller pays the taxes or assessments, that amount will be added to the balance due on the Contract.

INTEREST RATE. The annual interest rate during the term of this Contract is variable; it cannot increase by more than one (1) percent except to maintain the 2015 1.4 INTERESTRATE. The annual metestrate ourning the term of this contract is variable; it cannot increase by more than one (1) percent except to maintain the solvency of the Department of Veterans' Affairs. The Seller may periodically change the interest rate by Administrative Rule pursuant to the provisions of ORS 407.375 (4).

- PRE-PAYMENTS. Buyer may prepay all or any portion of the balance due on the Contract at any time without penalty. 1.6
- PLACE OF PAYMENTS. All payments to Seller shall be made to Department of Veterans' Affairs at 700 Summer Street, N.E., Salem, Oregon 97310-1201, unless Seller gives written notice to Buyer to make payments at some other place.
- WARRANTY DEED. Upon payment of the total purchase price for the property as provided for by this Contract and performances by Buyer of all other terms, conditions, and provisions of the Contract, Seller shall deliver to Buyer a Warranty Deed. Such Warranty Deed shall warrant marketable title, except for those liens and encumbrances referred to on page one of this Contract and those placed upon the property or suffered by Buyer after the date of this Contract. SECTION 2. POSSESSION; MAINTENANCE

- POSSESSION. Buyer shall be entitled to possession of the property from and after the date of this Contract. It is understood, and agreed, however, that Buyer will permit Seller and its agents to enter the property at reasonable times, to inspect the property. Buyer shall not permit the premises to be vacant for more than thirty
- MAINTENANCE. Buyer shall keep all buildings, other improvements, and landscape now existing, or which shall be placed on the property, in good condition and repair. Buyer shall not permit any waste or removal of the improvements, nor make any substantial improvements or alterations without the prior written consent of Seller. Except for domestic use, Buyer shall not permit the cutting or removal of any trees, nor removal of any sand and gravel, without prior written consent of Seller.
- COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS. Buyer shall promptly comply with all laws, ordinances, regulations, directions, rules, and other requirements of all governmental authorities applicable to the use or occupancy of the property. In this compliance, Buyer shall promptly make all required repairs, alterations, and additions. Buyer may adminitives applicable to the use of occupancy of the property. In this compliance, buyer shall promptly make an required repairs, alterations, and administs, buyer may contest in good faith any such requirements and withhold compliance during any proceeding, including appropriate appeals, so long as Seller's interest in the property is not
- PROPERTY DAMAGE INSURANCE. Buyer shall get and keep policies of fire insurance with standard extended coverage endorsements (and any other 9.1 PROPERTY DAMAGE INSURANCE, buyer stain get and keep posities of the insurance with standard extended coverage endorsements required by Seller) on an actual cash value basis covering all improvements on the property. Such insurance shall be in an amount sufficient to avoid application of any co-insurance clause. Insurance shall be made with loss payable to Seller and Buyer, as their respective interests may appear. In the event of loss, Buyer shall give immediate notice to Seller. Seller may make proof of loss if Buyer fails to do so within fifteen (15) days of the loss. If Buyer fails to keep insurance in force, Seller may obtain insurance, and add the cost to the balance due on the Contract. The insurance cost shall be payable to Seller on demand.
- APPLICATION OF PROCEEDS. All proceeds of any insurance on the property shall be held by Seller. If Buyer chooses to restore the property, Buyer shall repair or replace the damaged or destroyed portion of the property in a manner satisfactory to Seller. Upon satisfactory proof of restoration, Seller shall pay or reimburse Buyer from the insurance proceeds for the reasonable cost of repair or restoration. If Buyer chooses not to restore the property, Seller shall keep a sufficient amount of the proceeds to pay all amounts due under this Contract, and shall pay the balance of the insurance proceeds to Buyer. Any proceeds which have not been paid out within 180 days after their receipt, and which Buyer has not committed to the repair or restoration of the property, shall be used to pay first accrued interest and then the principal SECTION 4. EMINENT DOMAIN

If a condemning authority takes all or any portion of the property, Buyer and Seller shall share in the condemnation proceeds in proportion to the values of their respective interests in the property. Sale of the property in lieu of condemnation shall be treated as a taking of the property.

This instrument shall constitute a security agreement within the meaning of the Uniform Commercial Code with respect to any personal property included within the description of the property. Upon request of Seller, Buyer shall execute any necessary financing statements in the form required by the Uniform Commercial Code and shall description of the property. Open request of Seller, Super Sharlows any necessary mancing statements at Buyer's expense. Without further authorization from Buyer, Seller may at any time file copies of the Contract as financing statements. Upon default under the terms of this Contract, Buyer shall, within three (3) days of receipt of written demand from Seller, assemble the personal property and make it available to Seller.

- EVENTS OF DEFAULT. Time is of the essence of this Contract. A default shall occur under any of the following circumstances:
 - Failure of Buyer to make any payment when payment is due. No notice of default and no opportunity to cure shall be required if during any twelve (12)month period Seller has already sent three (3) notices to Buyer concerning non-payment or late payment under this Contract.
 - Failure of Buyer to perform any other obligation in this Contract in addition to payment. Buyer must perform obligation within thirty (30) days after

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- REMEDIES ON DEFAULT. In the event of a default, Seller may take any one or more of the following steps: 62
 - Declare the entire balance due on the Contract, including interest, immediately due and payable; (b)
 - Specifically enforce the terms of this Contract by suit in equity; (c) (d)
 - Exercise the rights and remedies of a secured party as provided by the Uniform Commercial Code. Seller may exercise these rights and remedies with respect to any part of the property which constitutes personal property in which Soller has a security interest. (e)
 - Choose to impose a late charge. The charge will not exceed five (5) cents per dollar of the payment in the event Buyer fails to make any payment within
 - Declare this Contract to be void thirty (30) or more days after Seller gives written notice to Buyer of Seller's intention to do so, unless the performance (1) Deciale this Contract is tendered or accomplished prior to the time stated. At the end of the thirty (30) days, all of Buyer's rights under this Contract shall cease without further act by Seller. Seller shall then be entitled to immediate possession of the property. All payments previously made (a)
 - Appoint a receiver. Seller shall be entitled to the appointment of a receiver as a matter of right. It does not matter whether or not the apparent value of the property exceeds the amount of the balance due on the Contract. Any receiver appointed may serve without bond. Employment by Seller shall not disqualify a person from serving as a receiver. Upon taking possession of all or any part of the property, the receiver may:
 - Use, operate, manage, control, and conduct business on the property and make necessary expenditures for all maintenance and
 - Collect all rents, revenues, income, issues, and profits from the property and apply such sums to the necessary expenses of use, operation,
 - Complete any construction in progress on the property, at Seller's option. To complete that construction, receiver may pay all bills, borrow funds, employ contractors, and make any changes in plans and specifications that Seller deems appropriate. If the revenues produced by the property are insufficient to pay expenses, the receiver may borrow, from Seller or otherwise, such sums as receiver deems necessary. These sums shall be used for the purposes stated in this paragraph. Repayment of such sums shall be secured by this Contract. Amounts borrowed from or advanced by Seller shall bear interest at the same rate as the balance on this Contract. Interest shall be charged from the date the amount is borrowed or advanced until the amount is repaid. Any amount borrowed shall be paid by Buyer on
- Elect to collect all rents, revenues, income, issues, and profits (the "income") from the property, whether due now or later. Prior to default, Buyer may operate and manage the property and collect the Income from the property. In the event of default and at any time hereafter, Setter may revoke Buyer's right to collect the income from the property. Seller may collect the income either through itself or a receiver. Seller may notify any tenant or other user to make payments of rents or use fees directly to Seller. Buyer shall reimburse Seller for all amounts expended in so doing on demand. Such action by Seller shall not constitute a waiver of the default or any other right or remedy which Seller SECTION 8. WAIVER

Failure of either party, at any time to require performance of any provision of this Contract shall not limit the party's right to enforce the provision. If a party waives a breach of any provision of this Contract, the waiver applies only to that specific breach. It does not apply to the provision itself. SECTION 9. INDEMNIFICATION

Buyer shall forever defend, indemnify, and hold Seller harmless from any claim, loss, or liability arising out of or in any way connected with Buyer's possession or use buyer snan rorever detend, incenting, and note sent narrings from any claim, ross, or nating data or or arrany way connected with respect to the property, or any condition of the property. In the event of any litigation or proceeding brought against Seller and arising out of or in any way connected with any of the above events or claims, against which Buyer agrees to defend Seller, Buyer shall, upon notice from Seller, vigorously resist and SECTION 10.
