517.042. "Legal subdivision" defined for ORS 517.042 to 517.052. As used ORS 517.042 to 517.052, unless the context requires otherwise, "legal subdivision" means a subdivision of a state survey or of a United States survey which has been extended over the keokraphic area to be described.

517.044. Location of claims upon placer deposits; posting notice. Any individual, a citizen of the United States, or one who has declared his intention to become such, who discovers a placer deposit of minerals upon the unpropriated public domain of the United States within this state, which is the property of the united states and mining laws of the United States, which is a placer claim thereon by posting in a conspicuous uniterals are subject to location under the mineral and mining laws of the United States, may locate a placer claim thereon by posting in a conspicuous place thereon a notice of such discovery and location. The notice shall contain:

(1) The name of the claim.

CLAIM INFORMATION

- I. Make a discovery of a valuable mineral deposit on federal land that is open to mineral entry and location. Necessary steps in locating a placer claim.
- 2. Post a completed notice of location on a post or monument at a conspicuous place inside the boundaries of the claim.
- 3. Locate the claim by legal subdivisions, or if not practicable or the land is unsurveyed, stake the claim within 30 days of the date of posting notice.
- 4. File copy of notice of location with county clerk for the county in which the claim is located. Filing fee is as set by ordinance of the county coverning body. Notice may be mailed in for fecording. Notice must be recorded within 60 days from the posting of the notice on the claim.
- 5. Record the claim with the BLM state office within 90 days after the date of location of the claim. If recording by mail, obtain a return receipt.

- 1. All placer claims must conform as nearly as practicable with the U.S. system of public land surveys and the rectangular subdivisions of such surveys, whether the claims are on surveyed or unsurveyed lands.

 2. No location may exceed more than 20 acres for an individual claimant.

 An association of two persons may locate no more than 40 acres in a single claim; a location by three persons cannot exceed 60 acres. No location of a location by three persons cannot exceed 60 acres in a single placer claim can exceed 160 acres whatever the number of individuals in the locating association.

A placer discovery will not sustain a lode location, nor will a lode discovery sustain a placer location. Vein or lode claims are generally located discovery sustain a placer location. Vein or lodes, For a lode claim there must be the summary of the summary of

Placer claims are generally located where minerals have been derived from rocks or veins to form deposits such as stream gravels and gold-bearing fallowium.
