Cook 12-4-84 6 Klamath County Exhibit R, Letter from Water Resources Dept. 7 The hearing was then closed, and based upon the evidence 8 submitted at the hearing, the Hearings Officer made the following 9 Findings of Fact: 10 FINDINGS OF FACT: 11 1. Applicant, Frederick D. Ehlers, was previously before 12 the Hearings Officer, James J. Spindor, on November 15, 1984, 13 under Conditional Use Permit 51-84. On the 9th Day of January, 14 1985, an order was entered granting a Conditional Use Permit to 15 construct a power generating facility on land designated Forestry 16 in the Klamath County Comprehensive Plan and zoned F (Forestry). 17 Applicant seeks to amend condition 5C requiring that "The power 18 line from the project shall be buried, and, to the extent feasible, 19 shall follow the existing road rights-of-way . . . ", and to 20 amend Finding of Fact 2, which reads in applicable part: 21 rated power capacity of the project would be 600 kilowatts . "The 22 The applicant does not challenge the Conditional Use Permit 23 Order in any other respect. 24 Testimony from applicant's representative, Steven Zamsky, 2. 25 was that: 26 Ά.

A. The intention of the parties at the hearing below was that the power transmission lines would be buried in the canyon so as to minimize impact there, but once out of the C.U.P. 9-86/Ehlers Page 2

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canyon it would be placed above ground on power poles in existing road rights-of-way, and That the change from 600 kilowatts to 1100 kilowatts would not affect a change in stream flow, fisheries habitat, minimum drawdown, water temperature, turbidly or stream levels, but instead represents improved technology and power The Hearings Officer finds that a hydroelectric power generating capabilities. generating facility is permitted as a conditional use under Land Development Code 51.020(D)(2). Land Development Code Section

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4. The increase in output allowed by the Federal Energy 44.003(a) criteria has been met. Regulatory Commission above the 600 kilowatts allowed in the 11 prior Conditional Use Permit occurs as a result of more efficient 12 generation systems. The Hearings Officer finds that the actual 13 output of the power generating facility is not subject to land 14 review criteria; however, any increase in the physical size of 15 the exterior structures, beyond those previously presented in the 16 November 15, 1984, hearing or any additional diversion of water, 17 drawdown, modification of stream flow, or other use of the 18 resources in the canyon which would adversely affect fish or 19 20

wildlife, would be subject to further review. Based upon the fact that the effects upon the river, 21 stream banks and canyon will not be changed, the Hearings Officer 22 specifically orders that the applicant shall not be constrained 23 to the amount of power which he may generate under the above 24 conditions. As the Klamath County Hearings Officer previously 25 26 concluded that the location, size, design and operating 27 28

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characteristics of the proposed development will be compatible with and will not have significant adverse effects upon the 2 appropriate development and use of abutting properties and the 3 surrounding area, review criteria 44.003(c) has been met. 4

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The Hearings Officer specifically finds that it was the 6. intention of the applicant at the prior hearing to bury the power 6 lines within the canyon but to permit power to be transmitted 7 above ground parallel to existing logging roads out of the canyon. 8 The Hearings Officer specifically finds that notice was given of 9 this hearing and of the purposes set for this request and that no 10 other person appeared to testify in opposition to the request. 11 The Hearings Officer therfore concludes permitting transmission 12 13 above ground outside the canyon meets the six Conditional Use 14 Permit review criteria found in Land Development Code Section 15 51.020(E). 16

The Hearings Officer specifically reviews this appli-7. 17 cation to ascertain any additional land use impacts and the 18 application to the Klamath County goals based upon the requested 19 amendments to the Conditional Use Permit. The Hearings Officer 20 finds the following Klamath County goals to apply, 21

Goal 1 (Citizen Involvement) has been met as notice has 22 been given to adjacent property owners, interested public agencies, 23 and published in the Herald and News. An opportunity for public 24 input has been given. 25

Goal 2 (Land Use Planning) has been met. 26 The intended use is conditionally permitted. 27

The Hearings Officer finds that the present application has no impact upon Goals 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12 and 14. C.U.P. 9-86/Ehlers Page 4

1 The Hearings Officer finds that the application is in
2 compliance with Goal 4 (Forest Lands) in that Policy 6 is to
3 encourage optimum utilization of rights-of-way so as not to pre4 clude forest growth. Above ground transmission as opposed to
5 under ground transmission will result in less disruption to the
6 forest floor.

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7 Goal 9 (Economy of the State) will be met in the increase in 8 power generating capabilities will increase the self sufficiency 9 of the County and shall provide greater portions of its power 10 demand.

Goal 13 (Energy Conservation) will be met. Increased power
generating capability resulting from greater technological
efficiency will result in greater cost effective energy
development.

Land Development Code Review Criteria 43.003(b) has been met.
Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Hearings
Officer makes the following Conclusions of Law:

18 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

19 1. That the use is conditionally permitted in the zone in20 which it is proposed to be located.

21 2. That the location, size, design and operating charac22 teristics of the proposed use are in conformance with the Klamath
23 County Comprehensive Plan.

3. That the location, size, design, and operating characteristics of the proposed development will be compatible with and will not have significant adverse effects on the appropriate development and use of abutting properties and the surrounding neighborhood.

C.U.P. 9-86/Ehlers Page 5 4. That the location, size, and operating characteristics
 of the proposed development will be compatible with and not have
 significant adverse effects upon the appropriate development and
 use of abutting properties provided that the following amended
 conditions are met:

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A. The applicant shall obtain all necessary State and Federal permits and shall follow all conditions which are part of said permit. The applicant shall provide the Klamath County Planning Department with copies of all State and Federal permits which are obtained.

B. The diversion pipeline and penstock shall be buried to minimize visual and physical effects on the area.

C. The power line from the project through the canyon shall be buried. Outside the canyon the power line may be above ground provided, to the extent feasible, all power lines shall follow within the existing road rights-of-way and any variance therefrom shall be subject to administrative review by the Director of the Klamath County Planning Department.

D. Nothing contained within this permit shall limit the applicant's ability to increase power generating capabilities provided, however, that no changes from those plans submitted at hearing for C.U.P. 51-84 which might affect the size of the diversion pipeline, penstock, generating building and support structures or in the diversion of water, stream flow, draw down, turbidity or water temperature shall occur.

E. The existing roads shall be used to reach the site and no new route road shall be constructed because of the

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9320 applicant's use. 1 The Hearings Officer, based on the foregoing, accordingly 2 3 orders as follows: 4 That real property described as . 5 "Being generally located on the North Fork of Sprague River, about nine miles northeast of Bly, and more 6 particularly described as the SE4 NW4 and the N5 SW4 of Section 29, N¹/₂ SE¹/₄ and SW¹/₄ SE¹/₄ of Section 30, Township 35, 7 Range 15, Klamath County, Oregon," 8 is hereby conditionally granted a Conditional Use Permit (9-86) 9 in accordance with the terrs of the Klamath County Zoning Ordinance 10 No. 45.2, and, henceforth, Conditional Use Permit 51-84 will be 11 amended.
