ORDER

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1. Nature of Application

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A hearing on this application was held May 23, 1989, pursuant to notice given in conformity with Ordinances No. 44 and 45. The hearing was held before the Klamath County Planning Commission. The request for three dwellings not in conjunction with farm use was considered pursuant to Section 51.017D.

II. Names of those involved

The applicant was present and offered testimony in behalf of this request. The Planning Department was represented by Kim Lundahl, Senior Planner. County Counsel, Michael Spencer, was present. James G. Grimes also offered testimony in behalf of this application.

III. Legal Description

The subject property is located in Sections 10 and 15, Township 39 south Range 10 east W. M.. Located generally north of Hwy 140 and west of Olene, Pine Grove area.

IV. <u>Relevant Facts</u>

The property has an Agriculture plan designation with an implementing zone of Exclusive Farm Use-Cropland. The property is 15 acres in size and is not under farm tax deferral.

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All evidence submitted as the staff report, exhibits A-G, and V. Findings offered testimony show that the approval criteria as set ot in the code has been satisfied: The Commission finds this ap-

plication;

1. is compatible with farm use because: Adjacent properties are not and cannot be devoted to farm use

have been for many years, as: A. The properties are unsuited for economic farm use. The cost of clearing the properties for farm use is в.

C. The livestock carrying capacity is 24 acres per animal \$300.00/acre.

does not alter the stability of the overall land use patunit month. 3.

Large lot rural-residential development has been established tern of the area because: in this area. The applicants proposal was found to represent

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a continuation of that trend.

4. is situated upon generally unsuitable land for the production of farm crops and livestock, considering the terrain, adverse soil or land conditions, drainage and flooding, vegetation location and size of the tract.

The soil series present has limitations to agricultural use. The terrain is steep and rocky over portions of the property. The size of the parcel, 15 acres, is not an economic unit. Water for agricultural use is not available.

VI. Conclusions and Order

The Planning Commission finds the applicant has satisfied the review criteria in that the correct notice was given, all relevant Comprehensive Plan Policies were complied with, and there were not compromises to Goal 3-Agricultural Lands. Therefore it is hereby ordered the request for Conditional use Permit 18-89 is approved.
