26 The Petitioner and Respondent have not participated in any

1 litigation concerning the children in this state or any other
2 state.

3 The Petitioner and Respondent do not have any information of
4 any other custody proceeding involving the children of this
5 marriage pending in this state or any other state.

6 The Petitioner and Respondent do not know any person not a
7 party to the dissolution who has physical custody of the children
8 or who claims to have custody or visitation rights.

9 **CHILD CUSTODY AND VISITATION PROVISIONS**

10 8.

11 The Petitioner is awarded full legal custody of the following
12 child: Katie Lynn Snyder

13 The Respondent is awarded full legal custody of the following
14 children: Lisa Christine Snyder, Megan Dell Snyder, and Lindsey Don
15 Snyder.

16 9.

17 The Petitioner and Respondent shall have visitation as
18 follows:

19 Monthly Visits:

20 1. The non-custodial parent has a right to visit the children
21 for at least one weekend a month.

22 2. For purposes of this ruling, a weekend is defined as
23 commencing at 6 p.m. on Friday and ending at 6 p.m. on the
24 following Sunday, except where there is a three-day school weekend.
25 In such instances, the weekend shall include the school holiday and
26 shall conclude at 6 p.m. on the last day of the weekend.

Winter Vacation:

1. The winter vacation times will be split between the two parents. One parent will have visitation beginning at 9 a.m. the day after school adjourns through 12 noon on December 26 in the odd numbered years, and begins at 12 noon on December 26 and ending at 3 p.m. the day before school reconvenes in the even numbered years.

2. The other parent shall have visitation beginning at 9 a.m. the day after school adjourns through 12 noon on December 26 in the even numbered years, and begins at 12 noon on December 26 and ending at 3 p.m. the day before school reconvenes in the odd numbered years.

Summer Vacation: The summer vacation will also be split between the two parents.

Whether or not the children are in school visitation will be allowed for a period of at least (4) weeks during the period of school summer vacation in the district in which they live.

Before June 1 of each year, the non-custodial parent shall select and notify the custodial parent in writing of the inclusive dates of the four-week visitation period, or the two-week visitation periods, as the case may be, which the non-custodial parent chooses to have the children.

Holidays: By agreement between the parties, the children should be allowed to spend the holidays together.

The non-custodial parent shall also have visitation in even-numbered years on the following holidays or during holiday periods:

1. Thanksgiving Holiday. Whether or not the children are in

1 school, commencing on the Wednesday preceding Thanksgiving at 6
2 p.m. and ending on the following Sunday at 6 p.m.

3 2. Memorial Day Weekend. Commencing on the Friday preceding
4 Memorial Day at 6 p.m., and ending on the following Monday at 6
5 p.m.

6 3. The Fourth of July Weekend. If this holiday falls on
7 Tuesday through Thursday, inclusive, visitation shall commence at
8 9 a.m. and end at 10 p.m. on the July 4. If this holiday falls on
9 Friday through Monday, inclusive, visitation shall commence at 6
10 p.m. on the day preceding the Fourth of July, and shall end on the
11 following Sunday (or Monday if July 4 is on a Monday).

12 The non-custodial parent shall also have visitation in odd-
13 numbered and the custodial parent shall have visitation in even-
14 numbered on the following holidays or during holiday periods:

15 1. School Spring Vacation. Whether or not the children are
16 in school, during the school spring vacation in the district in
17 which they reside, commencing at 9 a.m. on the day after school
18 adjourns and ending on the following Monday at 6. p.m.

19 2. Labor Day Weekend. Commencing on the Friday preceding
20 Labor Day at 6 p.m. and ending on Monday, Labor Day, at 6 p.m.
21 Other Holidays:

22 In addition to the foregoing visitation, the mother shall have
23 visitation with the children on Mother's weekend each year
24 commencing at 6 p.m. on Friday and ending at 6 p.m. on Sunday, and
25 the father shall have visitation with the children on Father's
26 weekend each year commencing at 6 p.m. on Friday and ending at 6

1 P.M. on Sunday.

2 Personal Plans:

3 The children will not be permitted to determine whether they
4 wish to visit with the non-custodial parent. Personal plans of the
5 custodial parent or children, school activities, church activities
6 and other considerations will not be reasons for failing to adhere
7 to the visitation schedule set forth in the Court's order. Only
8 substantial medical reasons will be considered sufficient for
9 postponement of visitation. Both parties will provide addresses
10 and contact telephone numbers to the other party and will notify
11 the other party of any emergency circumstances or substantial
12 changes in the health of the children.

13 Other Contact:

14 The non-custodial parent shall, in addition to the visitation
15 set forth in this order, have the unlimited right to correspond
16 with the minor children of the parties, and to telephone the minor
17 children of the parties during reasonable hours without
18 interference or monitoring by the custodial parent or anyone else
19 in any way. Unless otherwise agreed to between the parties,
20 telephone conferences between the non-custodial parent and the
21 children shall be limited to not more than three calls per week and
22 shall be limited to 10 minutes in duration.

23 Both parents shall be sensitive to the children's need to have
24 contact with the non-custodial parent as well as the need of the
25 custodial parent to minimize disruptions.

26 Restraint:

Both parties shall be restrained and enjoined from making derogatory comments about the other party or in any way diminishing the love, respect and affection that the children have for the other party.

Other Rights (ORS 107.154):

Unless otherwise ordered by the Court, and order of sole custody to one parent will not deprive the other parent of the following authority:

1. To inspect and receive school records and to consult with school staff concerning the children's welfare and education, to the same extent as the custodial parent may inspect and receive such records and consult with such staff;

2. To inspect and receive governmental agency and law enforcement records concerning the children to the same extent as the custodial parent may inspect and receive such records;

3. To consult with any person who may provide care or treatment for the children and to inspect and receive the children's medical, dental and psychological records, to the same extent as the custodial parent may inspect and receive such records;

4. To authorize emergency medical, dental, psychological, psychiatric or other health care for the children if the custodial parent is, for practical purposes, unavailable; or

5. To apply to be the children's conservator, guardian ad litem or both.

Parental Notification (ORS 107.164):

1 Unless other wise ordered by the Court, both parents shall
2 have a continuing responsibility, once a custody or protective
3 order concerning the children is issued, to provide addresses and
4 contact telephone numbers to the other parent and to immediately
5 notify the other parent of any emergency circumstances or
6 substantial changes in the health of the children.

7 Schedule of Deviations:

8 It is suggested that parties put mutually agreed changes in
9 writing so there will be no dispute as to those changes.

10 Visitation at School:

11 Each parent is encouraged to be involved in the education of
12 his or her children, both custodial and non-custodial. Each parent
13 may have contact with the non-custodial children at school on the
14 following conditions:

15 1. Only in the event such contact does not interfere with the
16 education of the children. Whether or not contact interferes shall
17 be in the sole judgment of the school authorities.

18 2. So long as the custodial parent has not delivered to the
19 school authorities a written statement that the non-custodial
20 parent is not to visit the children at school.

21 CHILD SUPPORT

22 10.

23 No child support shall be paid at this time because it is
24 agreed by both the Petitioner and Respondent. The Petitioner's
25 income is less and has custody of one child. The Respondent's
26 income is greater and has custody of three children. During the

1 period of separation it has been determined that the needs of the
2 children are adequately met.

4 Any medical, dental or vision expenses not covered by the
5 parties' health insurance shall be paid by both the Petitioner and
6 Respondent. The Respondent shall continue to maintain a one
7 hundred thousand dollar (\$100,000.00) life insurance policy naming
8 the children as irrevocable beneficiaries throughout the period of
9 minority.

13 (a) The Petitioner shall be awarded the following personal




