#### Personal Plans:

The children will not be permitted to determine whether they wish to visit with the non-custodial parent. Personal plans of the custodial parent or children, school activities, church activities and other considerations will not be reasons for failing to adhere to the visitation schedule set forth in the Court's order. Only substantial medical reasons will be considered sufficient for postponement of visitation. Both parties will provide addresses and contact telephone numbers to the other party and will notify the other party of any emergency circumstances or substantial changes in the health of the children.

### Other Contact:

The non-custodial parent shall, in addition to the visitation set forth in this order, have the unlimited right to correspond with the minor children of the parties, and to telephone the minor children of the parties during reasonable hours without interference or monitoring by the custodial parent or anyone else in any way. Unless otherwise agreed to between the parties, telephone conferences between the non-custodial parent and the children shall be limited to not more than three calls per week and shall be limited to 10 minutes in duration.

Both parents shall be sensitive to the children's need to have contact with the non-custodial parent as well as the need of the custodial parent to minimize disruptions.
