NATURE OF THE ASSERTED VIOLATION:

Respondent is alleged to have brought a significant collection of salvage materials and vehicle parts to a location on Edsall Street, Bly, Oregon. The Respondent is also alleged to have allowed occupancy of a shed on the property as a "residence."

NAMES OF THOSE WHO PARTICIPATED:

The matter was heard by the Hearings Officer February 16, 1996. The Hearings Officer in review of the violation was Neal G. Buchanan. The Respondent did not appear in person, although his letter dated January 3, 1996 was introduced in evidence. The Planning Department was represented by Kim Lundahl, and the recording secretary was Karen Burg.

3. LOCATION:

The property under consideration is generally located on Edsall Street, Bly, Oregon.

4. FINDINGS OF FACT:

- The Respondent's letter dated January 3, 1996 does not appear to contest, but rather to concede that the alleged violations
- The Respondent is in violation of the Klamath County Land Development Code.

5. ORDER:

- The Respondent is required to remove any persons utilizing the shed on the property as a shelter or "residence" immediately;
- The Respondent is ordered to remove the salvage materials, vehicle parts, inoperable vehicles, and related materials from the property on or before April 1, 1996, and not to again place such salvage materials, vehicle parts, and inoperable vehicles on the

property unless such placement is in strict conformity with the Klamath County Land Development Code.

C. Should the foregoing Order be violated, the enforcement officer is directed to cite the Respondent to District Court with fine set at \$1,000.00 to show cause why the provisions of the Code should not be enforced.
