## 1. NATURE OF THE ASSERTED VIOLATION:

Respondent is alleged to have "stored on his property east of Godowa Springs Rd., north of Beatty," a manufactured dwelling.

# 2. NAMES OF THOSE WHO PARTICIPATED:

The matter was heard by the Hearings Officer August 16, 1996. The Hearings Officer in review of the violation was Neal G. Buchanan. The Respondent failed to appear. The Planning Department was represented by Kim Lundahl, and the recording secretary was Karen Burg.

#### 3. LOCATION:

The property under consideration is generally described as being east of Godowa Springs Rd., north of Beatty.

### 4. FINDINGS OF FACT:

The Hearings Officer finds as follows:

A. That the Respondent has placed a manufactured dwelling on his property.

B. The manufactured dwelling appears to have been in place for a period of more than six months.

C. The manufactured dwelling appears to have deteriorated to a point whereby it may be unusable.

D. Klamath County Land Development Code Section 84.030 allows a maximum time frame of six months for manufactured dwelling storage.

#### 5. ORDER:

A. IT IS ORDERED that the Respondent, Herman Qualls II, make provision for the removal of the manufactured dwelling in a legal manner on or before September 1, 1996.

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B. Should the foregoing Order be violated, the enforcement officer is directed to cite the Respondent to Wood River Justice Court to show cause why the provisions of the Code should not be enforced.
