	of contamination, or a waste of the groundwater resource.
	2. All wells shall be securely covered to prevent any foreign substance from entering the well
	3. All wells shall be equipped with an access port or airline so that static water level information can be
	determined at any time.
	4. Well casing must be protected from damage and meet minimum extension requirements.
	3. Wells may only be permanently abandoned by a licensed and bonded well constructor or a landowner with
	a valid permit and bond. Well abandonment must be carried out in accordance with state rules.
