IN THE MATTER OF THE APPEAL OF HEARINGS OFFICER DECISION REVOKING CUP 70-96, ALBERT and STACIE PEUGH, APPLICANTS/APPELLANTS

1. NATURE OF THE CASE:

The referenced case, a Conditional Use Permit for a Kennel in the RS zone approved OCTOBER 3, 1996, was heard by the Hearings Officer JANUARY 17, 1997. An ORDER REVOKING the permit was entered JANUARY 28, 1997. The permit holders filed an appeal of this ORDER FEBRUARY 7, 1997. A hearing on this appeal was conducted by the Board of County Commissioners MARCH 4, 1997.

The appeal was heard pursuant to the procedure set out in Article 33 of the Klamath County Land Development Code.

2. THOSE WHO PARTICIPATED:

A listing of those who participated at this Hearing is on file with the Planning Department. The Planning Department was represented by Kim Lundahl, Senior Planner. Karen Burg, Planning Assistant, was the recording secretary. Members of the Board who heard the appeal were: Al Switzer, William R. Garrard, and M. Steven West.

3. CASE DESCRIPTION:

The Hearings Officer entered Order JANUARY 28, 1997 REVOKING an approval dated OCTOBER 3, 1996 allowing the applicant to maintain seven dogs on property commonly known as 2988 Hope St., Klamath Falls, OR 97603 and zoned for Suburban Residential uses (Art 51.5). A Kennel being considered via the Conditional Use Permit Process (Sec. 51.530 H).

The appellants submitted a five page letter dated February 14, 1997 setting out their grounds for Appeal. This letter was paraphrased by the appellant at Hearing and is on file at the Planning Department.

4. FINDINGS:

The Board finds after consideration of the record and argument entered that:

The Hearings Officer correctly interpreted and made findings appropriate to the action taken, REVOCATION of the Permit.

5. ORDER:

The Board of Commissioners, upon review of the record, testimony and argument presented, hereby *UPHOLDS* the Hearings Officer *ORDER REVOKING* the permit entered JANUARY 28, 1997, and attached.

FURTHER, the appellants are allowed until 90 days from the date below to bring their property in compliance with the Land Development Code by removing all but four of the dogs from the location.

This matter came before Michael L. Brant, Hearings Officer for KLAMATH County, Oregon, on January 17,1997, in the KLAMATH County Museum Meeting Room in KLAMATH Falls, Oregon. The hearing was held pursuant to notice given in conformity with the KLAMATH County Land Development Code and related statutes and ordinances. The KLAMATH County Planning Department was represented by Mr. Kim Lundahl and the recording secretary was Assistant Planner Karen Burg. KLAMATH County Planning Department file and all the exhibits and other contents therein is incorporated by this reference into this matter. The KLAMATH County Planning Department staff report was Based upon the evaluation of the staff report and received. consideration of the evidence received, the hearings officer makes the following findings of fact and conclusions and makes the following decision. Mr. Peugh, the applicant, testified. Mr. Bicknell, the complainant also testified.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The applicant was granted a conditional use permit to maintain a kennel to accommodate seven (7) dogs which were represented to be family pets belonging to the Peugh children. Subsequent to the granting of the CUP Mrs. Peugh made statements which caused the Planning Department to investigate the quantity of dogs being kept by the applicants. Mr. Peugh admitted that he had maintained nine

dogs for a short period of time while the extra dogs were ill. Mr. Bicknell testified that the dogs are very aggressive, noisy and caused the Bicknells to fear for their own safety. Mr. Bicknell introduced an audio tape which he played containing sounds of dogs barking and snarling.

CONCLUSION

It became apparent that the Applicants have been shuffling dogs to avoid detection that they were keeping more dogs than their permit allowed. The Applicants have been and are in violation.

ORDER

It is hereby ordered that conditional use permit 70-96 is hereby revoked. The applicants shall remove all but for (4) dogs from their premises by February 5, 1997.
