The hearing was held pursuant to notice given in conformity with the Klamath County Land Development Code and related statutes and ordinances. The Klamath County Planning Department was represented by Mr. Kim Lundahl and the recording secretary was Assistant Planner Karen Burg. The Klamath County Planning Department file and all the exhibits and other contents therein is incorporated by this reference into this matter. The Klamath County Planning Department staff report was received. The Applicants appeared. Based upon the evaluation of the Staff Report and consideration of the other evidence received, the Hearings Officer makes the following findings of fact and conclusions and makes the following decision.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Applicant wants to establish a Worker Residence in

conjunction with an established commercial use at 15642 Hwy. 66, south of Greensprings Hey., west of the Keno School. The site will include a building approved by Site Plan Review in March for firearms repair and retail sales. The Applicant's representative testified that the commercial use would not include the discharging of firearms on or from the premises. The only objection to granting the requested permit was from Wayne Kinnan who does not want firearms dicharged in the area. Mr. Kinnan does not like the local deer either.

The Conditional Use proposed is authorized by KCLDC Article 52.830F. The Proposed use meets the criteria required by KSLDC Article 44.030.

CONCLUSION

There is no reasonable basis upon which to deny the requested permit.

ORDER

The requested Conditional Use Permit No. 29=97 is granted.
