All wells shall be securely covered to prevent any foreign substance from entering the well. 3. All wells shall be excurely an access port or airline so that static water level information can be determined at any time. 4. Well cassing must be protected from damage and meet minimum extension requirements. 5. Wells may only be permanently abandoned by a licensed and bonded well constructor or a landowner with a valid permit and bond. Well abandomment must be carried out in accordance with state rules. 1.
