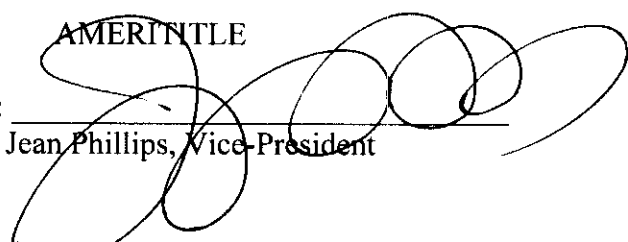
KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS,

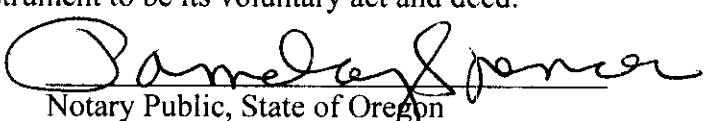

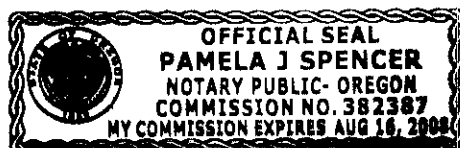
