### REVOCABLE LICENSE & ENCROACHMENT PERMIT

The City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, a municipal corporation (City) and Ken and Susan Pedersen (Grantee) for and in consideration of the covenants and conditions hereinafter set forth, agree as follows:

City hereby gives and grants to Grantee, its successors and assigns, upon the terms and subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, non-exclusive permission to encroach upon a portion of the Harmony Lane right-of-way in the City of Klamath Falls at 1710 Harmony Lane (as shown on the attached map Exhibit "A"). This license/permit is granted for the limited purpose of installing a retaining wall and is subject to the following conditions:

- 1) Grantee shall comply with all relevant local, state and federal regulations pertaining to Grantee's use of the area, including but not limited to, City Planning and building regulations;
- 2) Grantee shall submit the as-built construction plans to the City's Public Works Department and shall conform to any modifications or restrictions imposed by the Department; the face of the wall shall not encroach or interfere with the existing sidewalk in anyway; the wall shall not be extended east or west past the northerly prolongations of the east and west lines, respectively, of the lot; and
- 3) Grantee shall be responsible for the maintenance of the retaining wall and for all expenses for removal of the retaining wall, if required under this license/permit, and for restoration of the right-of-way damaged by maintenance or removal.

Grantee agrees to pay to the City, as compensation for the privileges herein granted, the sum of Eighty-One Dollars (\$81.00), receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by City.

Grantee shall save and hold harmless the City from, and indemnify the City against, any and all liability for or on account of any death or injury to persons, or damage to property incurred in any manner whatsoever growing out of Grantee's use or the public's loss of the privileges herein granted.

This agreement shall run from year to year unless terminated. It may be terminated upon sixty (60) days written notice by either party. Upon termination, Grantee shall remove all structures herein authorized and restore the public right-of-way in accordance with the directions of the City's Director of Public Works within sixty (60) days. Grantee agrees that City shall not be responsible for damage to any structures within the right-of-way caused by or related to City's legitimate use of the right-of-way.

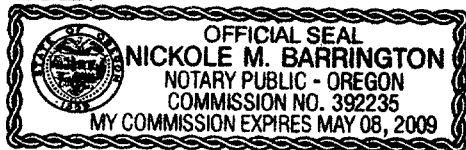

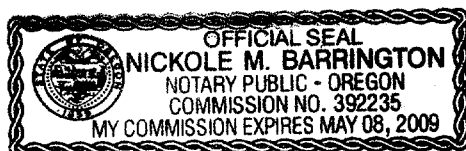
