SEE ABOVE REFERENCED TRUST DEED.

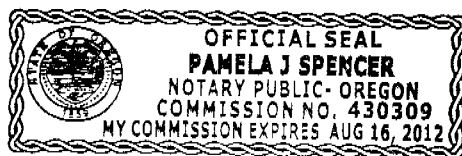
