1. Property affected: **TAX LOT 01000, TAX MAP 38S0932DA, ASSESSOR ACCOUNT R892247, TIMBERMILL SHORES LOT 14, PARCEL 4, KLAMATH FALLS, KLAMATH COUNTY, OREGON.**

Legal Description: TAX LOT 01000, TAX MAP 38S0932DA, TIMBERMILL SHORES LOT 14, TOWNSHIP 38 SOUTH, RANGE 09 EAST, SECTION 32 IN THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS, COUNTY OF KLAMATH AND STATE OF OREGON.

2. Based on environmental investigations performed in the area, hazardous substances present in soil and groundwater at the subject property are attributable to a former lumber mill (Modoc Lumber) that operated on the site from approximately 1947 to 1994.
3. A site-specific, DEQ-approved Contaminated Media Management Plan (CMMP) dated February 14, 2019 was developed for this property and is available in the DEQ project file and on-line through DEQ's Environmental Cleanup Information System (ECSI) database located on the web at www.oregon.gov/deq/pages/index.aspx under ECSI Number 6338. In accordance with the CMMP, the property owner must notify DEQ prior to disturbing contaminated soil or groundwater at the site. If contaminated soil or groundwater is disturbed or removed from the property, it must be managed and disposed per all applicable local, County, State and Federal rules. The CMMP provides guidance on the proper handling and disposal of contaminated soil and groundwater generated during future subsurface work. Contaminated soil and groundwater could present a risk to site construction or excavation

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workers. As provided in the CMMP, appropriate health and safety protocols should be followed during site development or utility work in the area.

4. Because the CMMP may be revised periodically, the property owner or operator should consult DEQ to confirm the most current version of the CMMP. The CMMP is available in the DEQ project file and on-line through DEQ's ECSI database located on the web at www.oregon.gov/deq/pages/index.aspx under ECSI Number 6338.

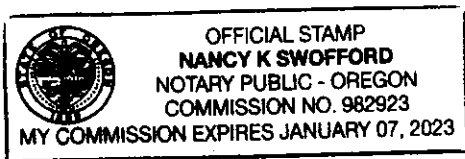
